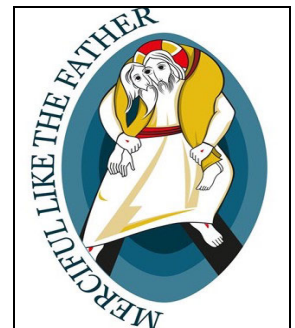

The Spiritual Works of Mercy have long been a part of the Christian tradition, appearing in the works of theologians and spiritual writers throughout history. Just as Jesus attended to the spiritual well-being of those he ministered to, these Spiritual Works of Mercy guide us to "help our neighbor in their spiritual needs" (USCCB).

The seven Spiritual Works of Mercy are listed below. After each work of mercy there are also suggestions and words of advice for living them out in our daily lives.



COUNSELING THE DOUBTFUL

Everyone has moments of doubt in their faith journey. Nevertheless, we should always remember that Christ is the Way, the Truth, and the Life and turn to him along our way.

- Encourage a friend who is struggling with believing to join a parish group for service or faith formation.
- Share a book you found useful in dealing with your friend's faith concern.
- Accompany a friend to worship at Sunday Mass.

INSTRUCTING THE IGNORANT

Learn about our faith and be open to talking with others about our beliefs. There is always something more to discover about our faith.

- Invite someone to go to Mass with you this weekend.

ADMONISHING THE SINNER

Do not judge, but be supportive in helping others find their way and correct their mistakes. Together we can learn to walk more closely with Christ.

- When you correct someone, don't be arrogant. We are all in need of God's loving correction.

COMFORTING THE SORROWFUL

Be open to listening and comforting those who are dealing with grief. Even if we aren't sure of the right words to say, our presence can make a big difference.

- Write a letter or send a card to someone who is suffering.

FORGIVING INJURIES

Forgiving others is difficult at times because we do not have God's limitless mercy and compassion. But Jesus teaches us that we should forgive as God forgives, relying on him to help us show others the mercy of God.

- Let go of grudges.

BEARING WRONGS PATIENTLY

Do not be bitter about wrongs done against you. Place your hope in God so that you can endure the troubles of this world and face them with a compassionate spirit.

- Frustrated with someone? Step away from the situation, take a few deep breaths, and pray an Our Father asking God for patience.

PRAYING FOR THE LIVING AND THE DEAD

Prayer is one of the most powerful ways we can support others. Joining together in prayer for the living and the dead entrusts us all into God's care.

- Keep your own book of prayer intentions, writing down the names of those whom you are keeping in your prayers

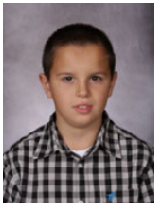
Heard It in the Hallway

The 5th grade recently read a piece in class titled "From Bees to Honey: A Beekeeper's Journal." The selection was a non-fiction piece. We practiced what we have taken from our Study Skills class this year to closely read and dissect the information presented. We used a graphic organizer to summarize what information was found under each subtitle, made slides on our Chromebooks to show what jobs both bees and beekeepers do during each season throughout the year, and made posters describing some of the tools a beekeeper uses. We even got to see some of these tools up close when Mr. Josh Stephens of Urban Renaissance Farms came to talk to our class. Mr. Stephens explained how he is starting a honeybee farm right here in Euclid, taught us about the bees he will be using, and showed us a hive and a real beekeeper's suit. Some of us were even lucky enough to try on the beekeeper suit! It was a great experience to see what we read about in class being used right here in our community.
