Dear Parishioners,

Welcome to Ordinary Time! Ordinary time starts when the Christmas season ends. Today is the start of the second week of ordinary time. We will have a good month and a half of ordinary time before Lent starts. Ordinary time is a beautiful time in the Church when we focus on finding God in the ordinary of our lives. God is with us all year long, each day of our lives.



This week we celebrate Martin Luther King Jr. Day, a day to recognize a great leader in our country who sought to bring unity and an understanding that each and every person was created in the image and likeness of God. All individuals, no matter what color their skin is, where they are from, if they are male or female, who their family is, how much money they have, and so on, have the same rights and dignities as everyone else. We will all meet God in the same way and be accountable for our lives in the same manner. When we meet God at the end of our lives, all we can take with us is our soul and how well we loved God and loved one another. It seems in the last few years a new strain of racism is developing and it is fierce. I feel very blessed to live in such a diverse community. However, I think this also comes with great responsibility to witness and advocate for the same things that Dr. King did many years ago. He is quoted as saying, "*we must learn to live together as brothers, or perish together as fools.*" Through prayer, personal inventory that leads to behavioral changes, and advocacy, I really do believe we can live out Dr. King's vision that is based on the exact same Gospel values that Jesus Christ calls us to live.

In many ways we are ahead of the game here in Euclid. In 2016, the Mayor called together the city's faith communities and their leaders. We have been meeting on a regular basis and have had two beautiful prayer services, one hosted right here at SRW. People of all religious, ethnic, and financial backgrounds have gathered together to pray. It was awesome and as close to seeing heaven here on earth as I can imagine! We all gathered to praise and honor Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. **The next prayer service is today, January 15, at 3:00 pm at Lakeshore Christian Church, 28010 Lakeshore Boulevard, Euclid.** While I cannot personally attend, Fr. Scott, Ellen Ivory, and other members of our staff will be there. I strongly encourage you to attend. It is a tribute to Dr. King and a visible sign of our commitment to a grassroots effort to bring unity to our community.

We will be embarking on the **ALPHA** journey beginning on January 24. Alpha is a series of sessions, conducted over ten weeks, that explore the Christian faith. Each talk looks at a different faith question and is designed to create conversation. Alpha is run all around the globe and everyone is welcome. We encourage you to come and invite your family, friends, co-workers, neighbors, etc. We especially encourage you to invite people who have been away from the faith or have no faith at all. Be bold!
