Mother's Day Cards



Heard It in the Hallway

In pre-school, we continue on our journey with the children in developing a relationship with the Good Shepherd. As preparation for Easter, the children heard the proclamation of the *Last Supper*. Jesus left us with the very special gift of his presence in the bread and wine and He wanted to REMAIN with us and us with him (Mark 14: 12-17, 22-26). After Easter, we have spent time with the lessons of the Easter Season, specifically *The Empty Tomb* (Mark 16: 1-8.) This is the announcement that Jesus has risen from the dead. After the lessons, the children are asked *wonder* questions for further meditation on the message they have heard. "I wonder how Mary felt when she saw that the tomb was empty?" "I wonder why the women were afraid?" "I wonder who the figure in white is?" Asking questions this way not only helps children to develop higher level thinking skills, but it helps them come to the realization that Jesus loves and cares for them and is always with them.



Worthy Warrior

This week's Worthy Warrior is Delaney Kinnaird. Delaney has experienced much growth in the pre-school program. She is attentive and considerate during group lessons and is extremely enthusiastic about learning. If only we could all be as joyful as Delaney when she learns a new concept! Delaney is kind and respectful to both her peers and adults and is able to navigate through the school day. Although young, Delaney is a true example of an SRW Warrior.


