It is up to the person to embrace Christ's truth. Just some "thought" for reflection.

Finally, Congratulations to our school! Our Preschool Program was recently awarded a 4-STAR rating from the State of Ohio. The highest you can get is 5 so we are doing pretty well! I am so proud of Martha Dodd who worked so hard with our preschool teachers to accomplish this. We are only the second Catholic school in the Diocese to receive this rating. It is time for our 2017-2018 PSR Program Registration. Our classes are held on Sunday mornings from 9:30-10:45 am and are for all students attending public schools in Grades K-6. The year will begin with a meeting with Fr. John for parents and students on Sunday, August 27th at 10 am in the Upper Hall of SRW School. Our first class will be on Sunday, September 10th. ROSE: Rose was born in Boston, Massachusetts in 1922. Her family moved to Detroit when she was 5 years old. She is one of five children, the sister of Mitch, Joe, John and Margaret. Rose said they did everything as a family and always had fun. When asked if she had any particular chores growing up, her son Joe said that she told of always having to sweep the back stairs.

One thing that received lots of attention was her family's pet lamb that they took for walks around the block! Rose said her parents were strict, especially in the way they handled their children when they got into trouble. She said they would do "...whatever hurt the most without hurting."

Her parents were Syrian and she enjoyed her mother's cooking – a big favorite being her stuffed-cabbage. Rose's first job was working in her father's small grocery store. During the Depression, there were periods when their business made only \$7.00 a day. When asked if she saved her money or spent it, she replied, "Are you kidding?" It was spent as quickly as it was received.

Rose met her husband Henry at a convention in Chicago and her son Joe said she played hard to get. Eventually they shared a dance...and danced the entire evening. Six months later they became engaged. It was a long distance romance. For one year leading up to the wedding, she would send him money to add to his own savings. They married in Detroit and began their life together in Henry's hometown-Cleveland.
